**Yearbook I: Intro to Yearbook  
(half year, 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> combined class)**

Current 6<sup>th</sup> graders: This application must be submitted during your counselor review session on your campus or to your campus counselor **no later than Friday, March 5.**

Current 7<sup>th</sup> graders: This application must be submitted to your math teacher **no later than Friday, Feb. 12.**

**Course description:**

**Yearbook I** is a one-semester curriculum for yearbook journalism. This basic course provides an introduction on how to produce a student-run publication, such as the Highlander Yearbook. The topics covered will enable the student to be a productive member of a publications staff in the future. This class does not produce the yearbook but supports the Highlander Yearbook Staff (Yearbook II) in any extra duties during the fall semester.

**Who should take the class?**

Seventh graders who wish to apply for the Highlander Yearbook Staff in eighth grade should consider taking **Yearbook I**. It is NOT a prerequisite to Yearbook II, however, students who take Yearbook I as seventh graders are given priority consideration for a limited number of spots for the eighth grade, full-year class (**Yearbook II**).

Eighth graders who are interested in pursuing journalism courses in high school should also consider taking **Yearbook I**, as it provides a broad foundation of the skills required to produce a student-run publication.

**Topics Covered:**

Students will learn there is far more to planning and producing a publication than selecting pictures to fill a page. Each person in the class will be responsible for writing *quality* stories and captions, conducting interviews independently, maintaining organized photo files, creating layouts on the computer, and proofreading and editing layouts.

Students will also go beyond point-and-shoot photography by combining the technical aspects of the DSLR camera with basic rules of composition. (A camera is not required for the course.)

Grades will be evaluated not only on the student's mastery of these skills, but also on the student's ability to meet deadlines.

**Required Skills**

Students should be comfortable using the computer, enjoy writing stories, interviewing, and designing layouts. In addition, students should portray the following characteristics:

- Strong work ethic
- Interest in writing
- School pride
- Cooperative team player
- Creative and open-minded
- Self-directed, ability to work independently
- Ability to plan and meet deadlines
- Receptive to feedback
- Trustworthy and responsible\*

*\*Students in the course are entrusted with expensive equipment to carry out daily assignments.*

**To Apply**

Please give your *signed* application to your counselor when you meet to select courses. **Applications must be received during the course selection window to be considered.** Current McC 7<sup>th</sup> graders will turn this in when they meet with their counselors during math class.
