Rules, Expectations & Consequences

Rules

Follow directions and procedures.

Use appropriate words and tone.

Keep hands, feet, and all objects to yourself.

Cell phones must be secured in student backpacks and in their assigned cubby during class. Gum chewing is prohibited in the choir room.

Strive to do your best work.

Expectations

Show respect for the director, peers and rehearsal time.

Actively participate with a positive attitude.

Have good posture, energy, and enthusiasm.

Raise your hand to be called on or to leave your seat.

Please do not bring gum, food, drinks, or candy into class without permission.

Please leave all backpacks, binders and books in the storage area.

Bring only the required materials to your seat.

Please be in your assigned seats with your choir folder and other required items when the bell rings.

Please ask for permission to play the piano, use the phone, or enter the directors' office.

Consequences

Verbal Warning Parent Contact Office Referral

Any serious offense, such as defiance or fighting will result in an immediate office referral. Serious/persistent violations or CISD Student Code of Conduct violations may result in removal from Choir.



Grading Policy

Choir members will receive a grade in choir each nine-weeks. Grades will be based on the following criteria:

- Major Grades: Participation in class, Participation in Concerts, written and digital activities and assessments, and projects
- Quiz Grades: Sight reading tests, song checks, after-school rehearsal attendance, and written assignments
- Daily Grades: Posture, supplies/folder checks, turning in required forms, etc.....

*Concert performances are required. They fulfill the performance requirement for the TEKS. Therefore, those performances are graded assignments.

Concert Attendance Policy

- If a choir member must miss a concert performance, notification must be sent to one of the directors via email or written note PRIOR to the day of the performance or the student will receive a zero.
- Only the directors will decide if the absence is excused or unexcused.
- Alternate assignments will be given to students who have been granted an excused absence by the directors.
- If no notification is given or the absence is not excused, students will receive a major grade of a zero.
- Excused Absence: *CISD events, illness (Student was absent from school.), death in the family.
- Any other absence will be excused solely at the discretion of the directors.
- Depending on the nature of the absence, students MAY be able to complete an alternate assignment for a grade of 70.
- Examples of unexcused absence resulting in a grade of 0: no notification, private P.E. practice or game, private dance or drill team rehearsal or performance, birthday party, taking a family member to dinner, relative in town, private team/league practices, etc....
- *The choir directors and the school sponsor/coach work together so that the students can participate in both events. However, if there is no solution and the student must be absent from a concert/rehearsal, they will be given an alternate assignment.

Concert grading criteria

- Students will be assessed on their performance efforts, behavioral concert etiquette and overall mastery of the content prepared.
 - Points will be deducted if students are found to be lacking in any of the specified aspects above. Deductions will be assessed by the directors and related specifically to the elements students lacked in.
 - Referrals may also be written for behavioral issues if deemed necessary by the directors.

Student Code of Conduct.

Standards for Student Conduct Each student is expected to:

- Demonstrate courtesy, even when others do not.
- Behave in a responsible manner, always exercising self-discipline.
- Attend all classes regularly and on time.
- Prepare for each class; take appropriate materials and assignments to class.
- Meet District and campus standards of grooming and dress.
- Obey all campus and classroom rules.
- Respect the rights and privileges of students, teachers, and other District staff and volunteers.
- Respect the property of others, including District property and facilities.
- Cooperate with and assist the school staff in maintaining safety, order, and discipline.
- Adhere to the requirements of the Student Code of Conduct.
- Refrain from language that is discriminatory in any manner to others.

Conduct Before and After School

Teachers and administrators have full authority over student conduct at before and after school activities on District premises and at school sponsored events off District premises, such as play rehearsals, club meetings, athletic practices, and study groups or tutorials. Students are subject to the same rules of conduct that apply during the instructional day and will be subject to consequences established by the Student Code of Conduct or any stricter standards of behavior established by the sponsor for extracurricular participants.

Extracurricular Code of Conduct

Extracurricular Codes of Conduct Sponsors of student clubs, performing groups such as band, choir, and drill team, and athletic teams may establish standards of behavior, including consequences for misbehavior, that are stricter than those for students in general. If a violation is also a violation of school rules, the consequences specified by the Student Code of Conduct or by Board policy shall apply in addition to any consequences specified by the organization's standards of behavior. Students can be removed from extracurricular organizations, such as Mixed Choir or Region Choir if the code of conduct is not abided by.

Academic Eligibility Guidelines

Academic Eligibility Guidelines

According to the UIL no pass, no play guidelines, a student must be passing classes with a 70 or above in order to participate in events that are competitive, require a fee, or take students out of class. Determining eligibility can be confusing for many parents. Please read the statements below to help you determine if your child is eligible

- Eligibility can be gained or lost according to the child's report card
- If your child passed all classes with a 70 or higher on the report card, they are eligible for the entire nine-weeks.
- If your child did not pass all classes on their report card, they have the
 opportunity to gain eligibility on the next progress report
- In order to gain eligibility with a progress report, they must be passing ALL subjects
- Eligibility can be gained on a progress report, but it cannot be lost on a progress report.
- Once a student gains eligibility through a progress report, they are eligible until the next report card.
- Eligibility rules apply to events in which there is a fee or a competition.
- Please note that students WILL participate in all required concerts regardless of academic eligibility.

A CISD Progress Reports and Eligibility calendar is included in the choir handbook. Please refer to it as needed. All activities that fall under the UIL guidelines have been marked on the choir calendar. If you have any questions, feel free to contact us. We will let your child know if they are unable to participate in an event due to eligibility.

ALL choir members are required to wear formal performance uniforms during formal performances.

Choir Dresses

- DO NOT CUT OFF MATERIAL to hem your dress. A deep hem is fine.
- Dresses should be hemmed by hand with black thread only. Please hem by hand, then press the hem. DO NOT use staples, tape, pins, iron-on material, or glue to hem the dress.
- The dress hem should cover the top of the foot, but not touch the floor.
- Remove the hem before you return the dress at the end of the year.
- DO NOT remove any tags from the dress.
- DO NOT WASH the dress.
- Uniforms must be returned the week after UIL (unless otherwise specified)

Wearing your dress:

- Wear black DRESS shoes every time you wear your choir dress. Black hose or knee-highs are also expected.
- Hair should be pulled back off the face, worn "half up", or pulled completely back in a ponytail. This is at the director's discretion.
- The pearl necklace (purchased through the choir program) should be worn with the dress at every performance. Small stud earnings are acceptable but are not required.
- Eating or drinking in your uniform is only allowed with permission from the director.
- If you outgrow your dress, contact your director as soon as possible to arrange for a replacement.

Choir Tux Pants and Vests

- DO NOT CUT MATERIAL to hem pants. A deep hem is fine.
- Pants should be hemmed with black thread only. Please hem by hand, then press the hem. DO NOT use staples, tape, pins, iron-on material, or glue to hem the pants.
- The pants hem should cover the top of the foot, but not touch the floor.
- Remove hem before you return the pants at the end of the year.
- DO NOT remove any tags from the pants or vest.
- DO NOT WASH the pants or the vest.
- Uniforms must be returned the week after UIL.

Wearing your tux:

- Wear Black DRESS shoes and black socks every time you wear your choir uniform.
- Hair should be combed and off the face.
- Eating or drinking in your uniform is only allowed with permission from the director.
- If you outgrow your uniform, contact your director as soon as possible to arrange for a replacement

Uniforms are the property of CISD. Failure to return a uniform or returning a uniform in damaged condition will result in being assessed with a replacement charge. Uniforms, like textbooks, must be returned in order to clear student records.



Required Costs

All students pay a \$80 activity fee to pay for their required items (choir tee, pop show tee, choir binder, and a uniform maintenance fee) and to help cover costs throughout the year. These costs include sheet music, classroom supplies, accompanist fees, instrumentalist fees, transportation costs, facility rental fees etc...

Making Payments

All payments for choir are made through our school financial system: School Cash Online. If you must pay by check or cash: All check and cash payments must be made to the school secretary before school.

Please follow the guidelines listed below...

- Check: Student's first/last name must be written in the memo line. The check should be submitted in a sealed envelope with the student's name and purpose for the check written on the envelope.
- Cash: Student must submit the exact amount. We do not have change. The cash should be submitted in a sealed envelope with the student's name and purpose for the cash written on the envelope.
